Making French fun

YOUNGSTERS have received certificates to mark the completion of their first year of learning French. The seven children, aged between eight and 11, have been taking part in La Jolie Ronde classes run by Guénaëlle Fairbrother at Newmarket's Catholic Church Hall. Mrs Fairbrother, who also runs classes in Burwell and Tuddenham, said: "Being a licensee of La Jolie Ronde is very rewarding as I can see how successfully the children have learnt and how much they have enjoyed coming to the lessons. "In their first year the

children have not only learnt a lot of vocabulary and expressions but they have also been introduced to La France and its culture.
